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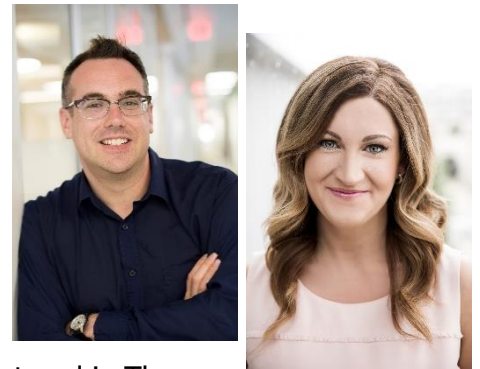

TITLE: Getting by with a little help from my friends: A comparative analysis of individual and group grades among college students.

PURPOSE OF RESEARCH: This research explores the relationship between individual and group grades for students in a first year college course. Current research indicates that grade comparison is usually between external variables, such as between students or between students and an environmental factor, but there is limited research on internal factors such as comparing a student's individual and group grade within the same class. The null hypothesis for this study is that there is no significant difference between individual and group grades for a student within the same class.

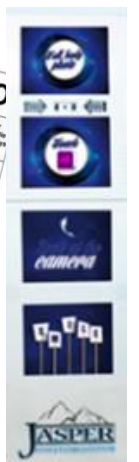


Photo Booth

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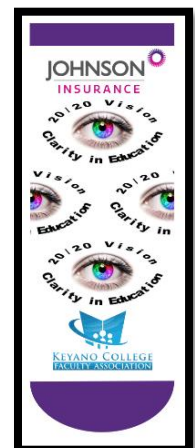

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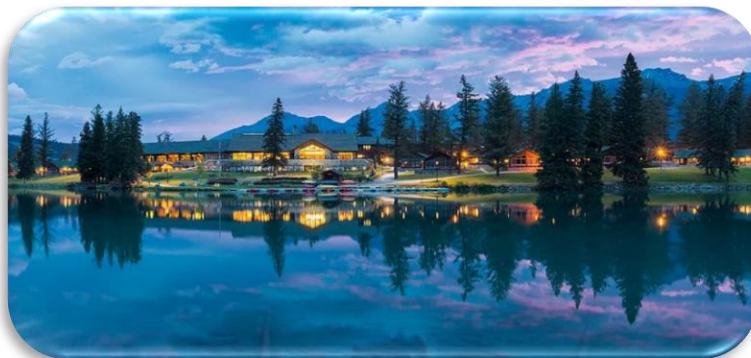
